Today's readings give us a clearer picture of who Jesus is, through two important prophets and a great missionary. In the prophetic words of Isaiah, the Lord has made plans for salvation, though the actual plan was yet to be revealed, until we read in the Gospel of St. John that our Lord has sent Christ Jesus to come and take away the sins of the world.

While we have just come off from the Christmas season, the readings today help us to understand better what the role of Jesus is. He is definitely the

Messiah foretold in the prophecies made by Isaiah, but specifically how will he save humanity? Isaiah speaks of the Servant who will be "a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 49:6). This mysterious figure, formed in the womb to be God's servant, points forward to the One who would accomplish what seemed impossible—the redemption of all people from the bondage of sin.

St. John the Baptist provides the answer to this mystery. He told us that Jesus "existed before him," characterising the fact that Jesus has always been begotten of our Father—the eternal Word made flesh. John the Baptist himself did not know too much about the coming Messiah initially, though he knew his role was to prepare the way for the Lord. Yet God revealed to him the sign: "On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptise with the Holy Spirit" (John 1:33). The Gospel of St. John gives us John the Baptist's powerful testimony that he has seen the person he foretold, declaring, "I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God" (John 1:34). What has been planned by our Lord has been brought to fruition.

The title John uses—"the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world"—connects Jesus to the Passover lamb whose blood saved the Israelites in Egypt, and to the suffering servant of Isaiah who was "led like a lamb to the slaughter" (Isaiah 53:7). Jesus is the ultimate sacrifice, the perfect offering who reconciles us to God not through the blood of animals, but through his own precious blood shed on the Cross.

St. Paul's second reading gives us a clear message that the salvation of the Lord does not come to the Jews alone, but to everyone, just as Isaiah was instructed to bring God's salvation to the ends of the earth. Paul addresses the Corinthians as those "sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy, with all those everywhere who call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours" (1 Corinthians 1:2). There is no difference between us who are brothers and sisters in Christ, "for he is their Lord no less than ours". You and I are equally precious to our Lord.

Our response to Christ Jesus ought to reflect the responsorial psalm today "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your

will" (Psalm 40). Like the prophets before us, we are called not just to receive salvation, but to bear witness to it.

Just as we welcomed Jesus into our hearts during Christmas, let us continue to keep him close to us as we take on the journey of discipleship as Catholic Christians, becoming witnesses who point others to the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. *Amen.*
