Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus went up on a hill, sat down and taught his disciples the beatitudes - teachings which describe the attitudes that God blesses and a description of the life that leads to true happiness. The large crowd that had followed them listened, and what they heard Jesus said must have surprised them because the beatitudes reversed all what they believed compared to the values of this world.

The central message of the beatitudes is that we can only find true happiness or be 'blessed' if we put our total humble trust in God and live according to his values. To be 'blessed' or 'happy' 'comes from the Greek word 'Makarios' which describes a person who is spiritually blessed and lives under God's favor with a deep, lasting joy that does not depend on circumstances.

The beatitudes contradict all what seem successful in the eyes of the world, and at odds with our human nature. They ask us to be poor in spirit, mourn in our life, to be meek, merciful, pure in heart, thirst and hunger for righteousness, to be peacemakers and undergo persecution willingly. Jesus taught that having these beatitudes lead us to God's kingdom.

The very first beatitude "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" means to be aware

of our own spiritual poverty and that we need God- that without God we can do nothing. Only when we are poor in spirit and acknowledge our own nothingness and total dependence on God, can he grace us with his blessings and use us for his own purpose. This attitude of dependence and humility is the gateway to the other beatitudes.

To be poor in spirit also means not to place priority on the material needs of this world. While this does not mean hating money or material things, it means we must not let these possessions be the center of our lives or let it define who we are.

In the second Reading, Paul gives us a timely reminder that God's call to us does not depend on worldly wisdom, strength or status.

He says,²⁶ "Not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth.²⁷ Rather, God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong," 1 Corinthians.

From the above we recall that those whom Jesus chose to be his disciples were mere fishermen and tax collectors who were transformed by the Holy Spirit into courageous witnesses and proclaimers for the Gospel.

The second beatitude, "Blessed are those who mourn" refers to those who are aware of the sinfulness of this life, mourning and weeping over pain, loss and injustice. This beatitude teaches that God comes especially close to those who are suffering and blesses them.

God also wants to bring comfort to the poor, the sick, marginalized and meek - to assure them their suffering is not the final word, but their reward will be in heaven. Jesus also assures that those persecuted in his name will be greatly rewarded in heaven.

"It is the Lord who keeps faith forever, Who is just to those who are oppressed, It is he who gives bread to the hungry, The Lord, who sets prisoners free. Psalm 146

Sometimes in life, we neglect to thank our Father God for his many blessings, and especially when things seem good and going our way, we attribute it to luck or our own talent. Only when we experience a sudden downturn or a dire situation, we turn to God and realize how much we need him.

Jesus is inviting us to trust in him, to let go of our pride and to be humble, merciful and seek God, so that he can take over. Despite the sufferings and challenges we may face in this world,

he gives us healing, hope and the promise of eternal life.
